	What does a life that fully trusts God in all things look like? How is it full of freedom instead of slavery to fear? In what ways are you tempted to doubt that God wants to freely give you all things?
	How does Romans 8:32 guide us in how we pray and what we should pray for?
5	Paul says that noone can charge or condemn God's elect. What charges or condemnations have been brought against you in your life as a Christian? Which ones hurt the most? Many times the most painful accusations and condemnations have come from those we are closest to.
	How should the truthes of Rom. 8:33-34 guard what we say to one another in the church? How should we draw a line between being busybodies and sincerely seeking to help strengthen a person who is falling into sin?
6	Read Isaiah 50:8-9. How does this verse along with Romans 8:33-34 give you confidence?
	How will seeking the approval of others ultimately rob us of confidence? PRAYER REQUESTS
	Whose approval do you want? God says, "In Jesus Christ, my Son, I approve of you. I count you righteous. I affirm you and love you as my holy child." How should this affect our feelings about the approval or criticism of others?
7	If Satan still "prowls around like a roaring lion" (1 Peter 5:8), how is he unable to bring a charge against God's elect or condemn them? Read Colossians 2:13-15, Hebrews 2:14 and Mark 3:27.
8	God is "for" his children. His provision for us is complete. We are certain that he will give us all we need. Meditate on this week's verses. How can you grow in your confidence of God's perfect provision for us? How can you help your brothers and sisters in Christ live with this kind of assurance?
