### THE DOCTRINE OF SALVATION – PART 2

- I. **Gospel Call (John 6:44; Acts 16:14; Rom. 8:30; 10:14; 1 Pet. 2:9; 1 Cor. 1:2, 9; 1 Thess. 2:12; Rom. 1:6-7e; 2 Thess. 2:14)**
  1. **Is God's call effectual?**
  2. **How does God call?**
  3. **Does this diminish human responsibility to respond?** (Is. 55:1-3; Matt. 11:28-30; John 1:11-12; Rev. 3:20; 22:17)
  4. **How should we approach God's call?**
    - We must continually call people to repentance (**Rom. 10:13-15**)
    - We must listen when God calls (**Heb. 3:7, 15**)

## II. Regeneration (Ezek. 36:26-27; John 1:13; 3:3-8; Eph. 2:1-5; James 1:18; 1 Pet. 1:3)

### 1. What is regeneration?

- “The divine impartation of eternal spiritual life into the spiritually dead sinner” – John MacArthur

### 2. Who does the work of regeneration?

- God the Father, through the Spirit, revealing the Son, using the Word (John 3:5-6; James 1:18; 1 Pet. 1:23; 2 Thess. 2:14)

### 3. How should we approach regeneration?

- Humbly thank God for doing a work that only He can do

## III. Conversion

### 1. What is conversion?

- Conversion is a response to the Gospel call, in which we repent of sin and place our faith in Christ

### 2. Repentance (Is. 55:6-7; Acts 2:37-38; 17:30; 20:21; Rom. 2:4; 2 Cor. 7:9-10; Matt. 11:28-30)

### 3. Faith (Acts 16:31; John 3:16; Rom. 10:9; Eph. 2:8-9)

*“When our Lord and Master Jesus Christ said, ‘Repent’ (Mt 4:17), he willed the entire life of believers to be one of repentance.” – Martin Luther*

## IV. Justification

### 1. What is justification? (Rom. 3:26, 28; 5:1; 8:30, 33-34; 10:10; Gal. 2:16; 3:24)

- Justification is the legal declaration of God that a sinner is righteous in His sight.

*“Regeneration is an act of God in us; justification is a judgment of God with respect to us.” – John Murray*

### 2. Imputed righteousness; propitiation (2 Cor. 5:21; Phil. 3:9; Rom. 5:19)

- Adam’s guilt imputed to us
- Our sin imputed to Christ
- Christ’s righteousness imputed to us

## V. Union with Christ (Gal. 2:20; 2 Cor. 5:14; Rom. 6:3-5; Eph. 2:6; Col. 2:12; 3:1-4)

### 1. We have died with Christ (Gal. 2:20; 2 Cor. 5:14; Rom. 6:3-4)

### 2. We have been raised with Christ (Rom. 6:3-4; Col. 3:1-4)

### 3. We live in Christ; Christ lives in us (Gal. 2:20; Col. 1:27)

### 4. We are seated with Christ in heavenly places (Eph. 2:6)
