<u>Finding identity by looking at the world</u> - watching how others answer identity questions. Receiving constant feedback from others on their own answers to identity questions. Calibrating and curating those answers for maximum affirmation.



 - Needs to be right \Box \Box Able to examine your deeper motives
 - Lacks confidence \Box \Box Able to takes risks—even to fail
 - Feels discouraged and defeated \Box \Box Encouraged by the Spirit working in you
- Strong-willed with ideas, agendas, and opinions \Box \Box Able to see God's goodness in dark times

Tends to be motivated by obligation and duty, not love \Box God truly satisfies your soul

- Solution to failure: "Try harder"
- Has a critical spirit (complaining and bitterness) \Box Trusting less in self and more in the Holy Spirit
 - Tears others down \Box \Box Aware of inability to fix life, people, and problems
 - A "competent analyst" of others' weaknesses \Box \Box Is able to freely confess your faults to others
 - Tends to compare yourself with others \Box \Box Doesn't always have to be right
 - Feels powerless to defeat the flesh \Box \Box Does not gain value from man-made "props"
- Needs to be in control of situations and others \Box \Box Experiences more and more victory over the flesh
 - Looks for satisfaction in "positions" \Box \Box Prayer is a vital, ongoing part of the day
