

In Galatians 1:11-24, Paul defends his credentials in order to prove the authority and authenticity of his message.

- When Paul eventually conferred with the other apostles, how did they react to his message and his ministry among the Gentiles? How does this contribute to the argument Paul is making about the authenticity of his message?
