4	What seemed to motivate Herod's actions in (Acts 12:1-5)?
	How does Herod's death highlight the centrality of the glory of God? In what ways do people today act like Herod in their vain attempts to steal (or even have a share in) God's glory?
	♥ How are you tempted to live for the approval of others (by the fear of man)? Have you ever acted wrongly for the sake of pleasing someone? What did you learn through that circumstance?
5	In Acts 12 what conflicts and contrasts does Luke draw explicitly and implicitly between King Herod and King Jesus? Remember God's word from the prophet Isaiah, "My glory I will not give to another" (Isaiah 42:8; 48:11).
	What lessons should we learn about the Lord's sovereignty from the way the events unfold?
