- 2 One of our culture codes is Committed Discipleship. Read Matthew 28:19, 2 Timothy 2:1–3, 1 Corinthians 11:1, Ephesians 4:11–16, Philippians 3:17, Philippians 4:9, 1 Thessalonians 2:11, then discuss the description below together and then discuss its key elements.

Committed discipleship is a life-long process of becoming more like Christ and helping others do the same.
